Y6 SATs

Reminder: Y6 children have their SATs this week. These are national examinations and children up and down the country will be doing them at the same time. Please ensure your child has a good night's rest and is on time in the morning (they can come into the class from 8:35am if they like to have a chat, settle their nerves and eat some toast!).

The schedule for the week ahead is: **Monday:** English: Spelling, Punctuation & Grammar **Tuesday:** Reading **Wednesday:** Maths: Arithmetic & Reasoning Paper 1 **Thursday:** Maths: Reasoning Paper 2

The children have worked extremely hard in preparing for these tests and we're sure they'll do really well. We are extremely proud of them, regardless of the outcome though. As long as they try their best, that's all anyone can ask for. School (and life in general) is about so much more than just exam results... it is about what you are like as a person and how you treat others.

School food

- We are aware that many families like to order school meals in advance. With this in mind, please note there has been a **change to the advertised menu** for this Thursday: children can choose from breaded chicken (or a vegetarian slice) with chips and beans or sweetcorn; with chocolate and vanilla pinwheels for pudding. Jacket potato / sandwich options remain the same.
- On the subject of school meals, we have been informed by Sheffield City Council that there is likely to be another price increase from September. We don't know what the new price will be yet but we will let you know as soon as we can. All prices are negotiated between SCC and Taylor Shaw (the catering company) school has no say in this.
- If you are worried about the above, it may be worth checking to see if you are entitled to income-based Free
 School Meals. You can find out more or apply <u>here</u>. This is definitely worth looking into if your child is in Y2 as they will not qualify for universal free school meals once they are in the juniors.
- Sheffield City Council have once again confirmed that they will be providing £15 food vouchers for eligible children during the May half-term holiday. These should be with you from the beginning of next week (wb 20th May).
