Reception Place Allocation

On **Tuesday 16th April**, the Local Authority will announce their Reception place allocations for September 2024. Parents should find out by letter and schools receive a list of who has been allocated a place - we hope all our Nursery parents get their first choice! If you are staying with us, we will be in touch with transition information shortly. If not, we will liaise with your child's new school to ensure transition is as smooth as possible. After places have been allocated, it is possible we may still have some spaces remaining. Parents can contact the school on or after the 17th April to discuss this if required...

Zones of Regulation

Building on what we have already done in the past, we will be adopting a whole-school approach to emotional regulation from the start of the Summer term. The 'Zones of Regulation' are intended to enable children to more successfully manage their emotions, understand other people's perspectives and talk about feelings in a more mature manner. The annual 'Bag 2 School' bags were sent out just before the holiday. These are for you to fill with old clothes etc. and return to school by 9am on Wednesday 17th April. This is an opportunity to have an 'end-of-season clearout' and also raise some money for school. Bags can be filled with clothes, shoes, handbags, bedding, towels and more (but no school uniform) and additional binbags can be used if your 'official' bag is full!
