Attendance

You should have received a letter about attendance last week alongside your child's registration certificate for the yearto-date. Please get in touch if notice any errors. Whilst we understand there may be genuine reasons for absence, we should be aiming for at least 95% attendance across the year. Anything less than 90% is classed as 'persistent absence' and has a negative impact on a child's chances of long-term success (there are strong links between good attendance and GCSE performance).
