Sports Days

Don't forget we are hosting our annual Sports Days this week. Children should wear suitable PE kit (including footwear) and is possible, something in their house colours (see below) – note, this doesn't apply to Nursery children. They should also bring a water bottle and be wearing a hat / suncream if the weather is hot. School dinners

- If you pay for school dinners, please could we request that you keep an eye on your **sQuid balance** to ensure there are sufficient funds to pay for the meals. We would never want a child to go hungry but we do not want parents to build up large debts either. We would generally recommend paying in advance so you have a positive balance in your account. If your child is in Y6, it is worth thinking about exactly how many dinners they're likely to have before the end of the year (to ensure you don't overpay).
- Meanwhile, we have been informed that there is likely to be a small **price rise** from September. Prices are set by Taylor Shaw (our catering provider) and school does not have a say in the cost.
- With this in mind, it is worth considering whether or not you qualify for **free school meals**. All children in Reception to Y2 benefit from free meals anyway but parents / carers are expected to pay from Y3 onwards.
